St. Paul's Hospital, situated in Vancouver, is the designated Heart Centre for the province of British Columbia. Cardiac subspecialty programs include cardiac imaging, intervention, cardiac surgery, electrophysiology, rehabilitation, adult congenital, heart failure and transplantation. We also have access to the BC Cardiac Registry computerized database of all diagnostic and interventional catheterization and cardiac surgical procedures in British Columbia. Currently approximately 20,000 echocardiograms including stress and TEE are performed annually. The SPH echo group have a special interest in imaging to guide structural interventions. There is a potential for significant exposure to adult congenital echo. Advanced imaging modalities such as speckle tracking and 3-D imaging are in widespread use.

The fellowship in advanced echocardiography is a combined clinical and research position. It is expected that at the completion of the training period that the fellow will be a competent echocardiographer with Level III training and clinical research experience. The goals and objectives of the Fellowship will be consistent with the Canadian Royal College requirements in the 'area of focused competence' initiative in adult echocardiography (AFC). One and Two year fellowships are available.
